PREFACE

Shattering all previous records by an unfathomable margin, the critically acclaimed, multiple award-winning, and internationally renowned poet and verse playwright, Ryan J-W Smith, presents an unrivalled demonstration of a poet's absolute mastery of his craft: *Rogue Shakespeare's Sonnets - Parts I, II & III* contains 2,702 of Smith's original personal/spiritual/political/philosophical/educational sonnets, written as the spiritual verse diary of Smith's alter ego, 'Rogue Shakespeare', from November 2007 through to September 2024 - spanning life in England, Florida, Australia, New York, California, Denmark, France and Spain. Like Samuel Pepys before him, Smith has written himself into history as the premier diarist of his time. But Smith's poetic masterpiece is so much more than *just* a mind-blowing 17 year long secret diary written in strict rhyming iambic pentameter! Boldly political, highly personal, and provably prophetic, Smith challenges the current global order, as much as he strips his artistic soul naked to better himself, for others - for all of us.

Transcending careers into film and law, Smith extensively interviewed and learned from countless experts, whistleblowers, rebels and great thought-leaders of our times - from former spies to MPs, Members of Congress, US Senators and Presidential Candidates; as well as many out-spoken doctors, academics and prominent international lawyers. Reading *Rogue Shakespeare's* epic spiritual, intellectual and physical journey, it becomes clear that, beyond earthly wisdom, Smith also channels higher, meditative sources of direct universal knowledge and awareness, as the reader witnesses him predict, again and again, the dire future we all now find ourselves in.

Ultimately, despite the hell of the 'brave new world' we are entering, Smith's promise of enlightenment manifests - as readers who follow *Rogue's* maverick path begin to master themselves. What began as a self-prescribed, therapeutic, reflective and proactive diary in verse, has now become a protective personal weapon of unequalled magnitude to counter the unbridled evils of the world. A wild, untamed mind is easily seduced and confused by those who seek to manipulate and control. Conversely, with every major and minor step of his life recorded in his unique verse, Smith demonstrates exactly how to negotiate and travel the immense and unpredictable path of discipline, self-control, inner peace and self-mastery.

Deep down, this is the sacred journey we all wish to take in our lives. Follow *Rogue's* humble path to truth - and in time, you will surely make it your own. *Nosce te ipsum.*

THE 2012 INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRST 500 SONNETS

(The first 500 sonnets in this book were published in 2012 in a book entitled '500 Shakespearean sonnets - The Diary of a Poetic Quest for Truth'. For reference, here is the introduction to that book.)

We all need self-improvement; some need it more than others - I've needed rather a lot.

For reasons I won't go into here, I came out of my childhood a troubled young man. Scared; over-sensitive; desperate for control - my behaviour could sometimes be selfish, hurtful and cruel, especially to those I was supposed to care for the most. Searching for a way to stop the broken record in my head, and the sad consequences before my eyes, I contemplated the easy 'painless' way out - but fate and an intuitive sense of purpose forced me to consider an alternative. Instead, I took the hard path: the one where you choose to stay alive; you pull your head out of the sand of denial and look honestly in the mirror; you admit to all your faults; you break down; in the darkness you find a path to love, compassion and forgiveness and, eventually, you perform a minor miracle - you change negative into positive: you let go of fear and hope.

After many failed attempts with therapists and self-help books, I suddenly found I made great strides by learning to meditate, reading Buddhist philosophy and working to integrate that philosophy into my daily life. I began to weave the lessons I was learning into my art - into my plays, my music, and the occasional sonnet. After a few years on this roller coaster, with wonderful highs - and lows that were certainly a vast improvement on the past, but still lows all the same - I began noticing a pattern: when I was knee-deep in writing a new play, or consumed in recording a new album, I was so much closer to the person I always wanted to be - so much kinder, more relaxed, easy-going and happy. Conversely, when I was in-between artistic projects (of a spiritual bent) and more concerned with ambition, some of the less attractive habits from my childish mindset would start to creep back in. I wondered, therefore, if it might be possible to find a daily artistic/spiritual ritual that would help to ground my mind positively in the here and now; a way to either get my grateful head on straight at the start of my day, and/or end my day with honest reflection, learning and affirmation.

At this point in my life, having written three plays in verse, as well as the occasional sonnet for BBC Radio Leeds, I knew I could easily scribe a sonnet in about half an hour. So, a sort of 'Sonnet Blog' seemed like the best and most effective idea to suit my needs. Late in 2007, I bought a website of the same name and began writing and posting a new reflective sonnet every day. Within a week I noticed a huge difference in how I was thinking, feeling and acting - as did the people around me and even those reading my sonnets online; after a few months I felt great (so great I stopped writing sonnets for a while - whoops!); now, after a few years and more than 500 sonnets later, I've never felt more at peace and

happy. That's not to say it was easy, or happened overnight - it's been more like travelling by taking two steps forward (when I write a sonnet regularly) and one step back (when I stop), over and over. But slowly, line-by-line, my sonnets have made an irreversible change in me for the better. For that I am eternally grateful to whatever gave me the idea to do it and the conviction to continue.

Developing the ability to truly see yourself as you really are (warts an' all), you start to see the world around you as it really is too. In tandem with my spiritual quest, my recent work as a filmmaker - and as a playwright beforehand - has given me unique opportunities to study areas of international politics and intrigue in-depth. With a good spiritual grounding, I have found it is much easier to deal with and accept as true some of the self-evident crimes of those we trust to take care of us: our governments; their agencies and representatives; familiar businesses, and a military that is supposed to defend, not invade. Having learnt the truth about the standard operating procedures of such organisations, I think it is important for artists to raise awareness, and I'm sure you'll notice some interesting political edges to a few of my sonnets (and plays, music, films - should you decide to investigate).

If you happen to read some of them, I hope you might bear in mind the circumstances in which my sonnets were written, as described above. Unlike my plays or albums, they were not written for any cumulative artistic or entertainment purpose at all - rather they were a (relatively) private medicinal means to spiritual ends. So, if (in a moment of madness) you decide to read them from start to finish, and bemoan that I'm repeating a theme over and over - please know that it's not because I'm lacking imagination to write about something new for you, my lovely audience - it's because I'm struggling to learn that particular lesson, and I have to repeat it over and over for myself, with no consideration (or expectation) for any potential future audience. Sorry.

With that in mind, I hope you find something of value here - a peek into the thoughts of a most imperfect man attempting to use his art to try to cure himself of some rather confused ideas of 'self' and 'others'. By revealing my failures and mistakes in this way, and the lessons I have learnt from them, I hope I can be of service to others.

For those who feel a little lost and alone in this world, I can highly recommend a couple of Buddhist books and a three or four-digit course of Shakespearean sonnets as a very effective medicine - I'm already well into my next 500.☺

By that I mean the concept of your 'self'.

I love the night, the quiet solitude,

When I against my selfish self may feud,

The morning light shows darkness in your eyes;
Your perfect mind - one second - you exist,
Then you re-don your 'self' - your fool's disguise;
The point of life and death you gently twist.
*"What must I do today? Chase money, right?
Make sure my checklist lists its cheques, for sure!

And as I grew, he told me how to see;
He claimed that he was righteous - how he lied!

Born in England, in the 7th hour, of the 7th day, in the 7th month, in the rebellious 1970's, Ryan J-W Smith is primarily: a critically acclaimed poet; a multi award-winning verse playwright; a critically acclaimed actor/director/producer; a festival-winning filmmaker; a composer and musician; a legal scholar; and, a successful business entrepreneur working professionally in the entertainment industry for over thirty years.

From the age of five until fifteen, Smith trained to be a professional tennis player - beating Britain's future Men's Number 1 in straight sets at the age of thirteen. Wimbledon was in his sights... Injury at the age of fifteen may have subsequently set him on a different path, but Ryan never lost the champion's mindset: one of vision, dedication, positivity, iron-clad resilience and, above all else, an extraordinary work ethic.

Receiving a full scholarship from the E.U., Smith read Theatre Studies at Trinity College, Dublin. During his studies he was also awarded a scholarship from Trinity as the highest achieving student in his year.

After Trinity, Ryan quickly evolved to become a multi award-winning verse playwright/director/producer/actor via his own theatre company, Rogue Shakespeare®. His artistic accolades in this area include: OFFIES Award Winner 2025; two-time Hollywood Fringe International Award Winner (and four-time nominee); two-time Encore Producers' Award Winner; Hollywood Fringe Comedy Award Nomination; Amnesty International Freedom of Expression Award Nomination; Gandhi Foundation Award Recipient; three-time Arts Council England Award Recipient, and countless professional 4 and 5-star reviews.

Having now written over 3,300 Shakespearean sonnets, along with 7 verse plays, Smith has firmly established himself as a uniquely dedicated, internationally acclaimed, award-winning poet.

Ryan is also a musician (primarily playing guitar, piano & singing) and a composer. His first two solo albums were originally released with Universal Music in 2006; now re-released in 2025 with Virgin Music under his pseudonym, ‘Rogue Shakespeare’, along with three more albums and an EP.

Smith is also a festival-winning filmmaker. His films have been shown, selected for, nominated or won their categories at over 25 international film festivals, including Cannes.

Ryan graduated from law school with a Master's Degree in Law, awarded with distinction. He has a particular focus and interest in Medical Law and Ethics; Contract Law; EU Law, and Criminal Law. Smith is a very strong advocate of civil liberties, freedom of speech, and bodily autonomy.
